A New Lease On Life

Having your own place to call home is everything. With Home Sweet Home's Rapid Rehousing program, we help people in need get into a home of their own as fast as possible. In response to the affordable housing crisis, our Director of Community Outreach, Steve Tassio, and Housing Navigator, Jacob Phillips, have started a new Master Leasing initiative to help provide access to housing for those who need it.

"We are excited to explore this new opportunity. Master Leasing offers us the ability to house clients who may not be able to get into an apartment due to barriers such as income, credit score, or no rental history," shares Steve.

Here's how it works: A landlord or property owner leases a unit to Home Sweet Home. As the listed tenant of that unit, HSHM can then sublease that unit to an individual or family within the Rapid Rehousing Program.

"This helps to eliminate barriers for participants to get into housing because the property owner entrusts Home Sweet Home with the qualifications of the applicants," adds Jacob. "It also gives us added flexibility to tailor the length of the lease to fit each

client's timeline, offering 3-, 6-, and 12-month leases."

Master Leasing also helps to decrease the number of evictions on people's records as staff can work directly with the participant to alleviate issues that arise while providing case management support.

"In a market where income, credit score, and background requirements are high, Master Leasing has been a bright spot," exclaims Jacob. HSHM signed our first Master Lease back in October. We have an individual in a 1-bedroom studio and a family of four in a 3-bedroom apartment that now have a place to call home.

Exploring Medical Respite

As HSHM continues to seek new approaches to better serve those in need, we are pleased to share some exciting news. Home Sweet Home has received a \$68,000 grant from the Illinois Public Health Institute as part of their Medical Respite Capacity Building Initiative. Medical Respite provides medical care, social services, and a safe place to recuperate for people experiencing homelessness after leaving the hospital. Over the next several months, HSHM staff will be developing a plan to help increase local capacity for Medical Respite in our community. We are blessed to explore this opportunity and look forward to closing the gap in transitional care for patients experiencing homelessness.
